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Preface

This is an Annual Report of Rani Rashmoni Green University (RRGU), Tarakeswar, Hooghly, West Bengal, covering the period July 2025 to June 2026. This report encapsulates the academic and administrative activities undertaken by the different departments and offices of RRGU during the above-mentioned period. It aims to highlight the progress and achievements of our students, resource persons, officers and staff members, showcasing our commitment to academic excellence and sustainability. The university has made significant strides during this period in academic and administrative developments. RRGU has been selected under West Bengal-Fostering Infrastructure for Science & Technology (WB-FIST), under the Department of Science and Technology and Biotechnology (DSTBT), Govt. of West Bengal. Consistent with its founding vision, the University remains firmly committed to environmental sustainability. The Campus Greenery Project, launched during the observance of “Van Mahotsav 2025”, represents a significant initiative in promoting ecological awareness and sustainable campus development. The project has been undertaken with the support of the West Bengal Pollution Control Board and the Directorate of Forests, Howrah Division, which have extended financial and logistical assistance, including the supply of

rare and environmentally significant saplings. As part of our efforts to inculcate environmental awareness among our students, RRGU has introduced a unique initiative where students are being awarded a full mark of ten (10) for planting and caring a sapling, which is added to their academic credits. Also, RRGU received another project on Mission LiFE (Lifestyle for Environment) EEP Program that was launched on January 19, 2026. The West Bengal State Pollution Control Board, Kolkata has sponsored this project that spanned during January to March, 2026. Our students have excelled in various competitive examinations, including NET, GATE, and SET, and have been admitted to Ph.D. programs in different reputed universities and research institutions. This is a testament to the quality of education and research opportunities provided by our University. The University has also undertaken different administrative initiatives, including the installation of an EPBX connection to facilitate seamless communication among officers and office staff. Our focus on administrative development is matched by our commitment to academic growth, with plans to introduce new postgraduate courses in the session 2025-27. University aims to emerge as an

Ecotourism cum Education Hub (Shaibo Tirtha, birthplaces of Sri Ramakrishna, Sarada Devi, Raja Rammohan Ray and the ancestral place of Dr. Syama Prasad Mookerjee. The University promotes and nurtures the agricultural aspects of the region (potato and vegetable hub of West Bengal). The university promotes the *Indian Knowledge System* by accepting it into the curricula (Life and works of Lokmata Rani Rashmoni Devi,

It is really a great honour to inform you all that from the last academic session, Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal has entrusted RRGU to undertake more programs, viz., Masters in Business Administration, Medical Laboratory and Technology, Library and Information Science, Journalism and Mass Communication, Agricultural Marketing and Management. In spite of limited number of students, RRGU has given full drives in incepting the programs.

We are indebted to the authorities of Government General Degree College, Singur (GGDC), Tarakeswar Degree College (TDC) and Rabindra Mahavidyalaya (RM), Champadanga, Hooghly, West Bengal for their magnanimities in extending their kind cooperation and continuous support.

Eminent persons have generously joined RRGU as Professor of Eminence and Excellence. Some noted scholars have also generously joined as Adjunct Professors. Green Policy of the University

1. Title and Commencement:

1.1 This Policy shall be called the Rani Rashmoni Green University Green Policy – 2025 or hereafter called RRGU Green Policy-2025.

1.2 This Policy shall apply to the New Campus of RRGU at Tarakeswar, Hooghly, and shall regulate all future development of greenery, landscape and campus environment systems.

2. Vision to establish RRGU as a demonstration model of ecological sustainability in Eastern India through climate-responsible, indigenous biodiversity-based, circular and regenerative campus development practices.

3. Guiding Principles: The following principles shall guide all planning, development and management activities:

- a) Green Campus First (GCF) principle: Ecological and biodiversity considerations shall precede any civil construction.
- b) Native First (NF) principle: Preference to native, local, pollinator-friendly species of plants and trees.
- c) No Net Loss of Green (NNLG) principle: Minimum 1:3 tree replant ratio for any tree removal.
- d) Water Positivity (WP) principle: Rainwater harvesting, onsite recharge, recycling and grey water use shall be maximized.
- e) Zero Waste Campus (ZWC) principle: Biodegradable waste shall be converted to compost/manure and utilised for campus greenery.

4. Green Campus Development Components RRGU shall establish the following essential systems:

- a) Green Spine: Continuous linear plantation zone along the main transit axis of the campus.
- b) Micro Forests: (Miyawaki /Native Biodiversity Clusters) in multiple blocks of minimum 100 sq. m each.
- c) Thematic Gardens: (e.g., Medicinal Plant Garden, Bonsai Garden, Butterfly Garden, Agro-Ecology Learning Patch).
- d) Campus Herbarium and Seed Bank for conservation and academic research.
- e) Water Bodies & Recharge Structures: check dams, recharge pits, rain tanks.
- f) Solid Waste Segregation & Compost Yard to generate compost for campus.

5. Standards and Norms

- 5.1 Minimum 33% of total campus land area shall be earmarked and preserved as green cover.
- 5.2 Minimum 50% of annual fresh water demand shall be met through rainwater harvesting and water recycling by 2030.
- 5.3 Use of chemical pesticides or fertilizers shall be discouraged. Organic, integrated pest management (IPM) strategies shall be mandated.

6. Community Participation

- 6.1 University shall institute an RRGU Green Council headed by the Vice-Chancellor with student eco-volunteers, faculty and estate division members.
- 6.2 “One Student One Tree” program shall be implemented for new student batches.
- 6.3 Department of Botany, Zoology, Geography, Environmental Science, Anthropology and related fields shall be actively integrated in green campus projects as “Living Laboratory”.

7. Monitoring and Reporting

7.1 Annual Green Campus Audit shall be conducted and placed before the Governing Board.

7.2 Yearly “RRGU Green Campus Report” shall be published and uploaded on the University website.

8. Funding Green projects shall be implemented through:

- i) University budget allocation
- ii) Govt. grants (State, National & International)
- iii) Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) support from industries
- iv) Student and Alumni Green Fund contributions

9. Amendment: This policy may be amended, modified or expanded by the University authority, as per requirement in public interest.

Activity Report: Observance of National Nutrition Month-2025

The Department of Nutrition and Public Health, Rani Rashmoni Green University, observed National Nutrition Month-2025 as a community outreach programme at Ratanpur village, Singur Block, Hooghly, West Bengal, on 23rd September, 2025. The programme aimed to create awareness on nutrition and healthy eating, assess the nutritional status of rural populations, provide diet counselling based on local and affordable foods, dispel food myths, and give students hands-on field experience in community nutrition. The event was inaugurated by Shri Becharam Manna, Hon'ble Minister for Agricultural Marketing, Panchayat and Rural Development, Govt. of West

Bengal, and graced by Prof. Amiya Kumar Panda, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, RRGU. Students of 1st and 3rd semester, under faculty guidance, conducted house-to-house visits. They took anthropometric measurements like height and weight, assisted in clinical assessments for nutritional deficiencies, provided nutrition counselling, and suggested healthy, low-cost diets using locally available foods. They also worked to eliminate food faddism and misconceptions in the community.



The activity enabled students to develop practical skills in nutrition assessment, communication, counselling, and teamwork, while understanding real challenges in rural health. The response from villagers was highly positive. They actively participated and appreciated the guidance. Overall, the programme successfully promoted nutritional awareness and strengthened experiential learning, reflecting the department's commitment to community engagement.

Department of Medical Laboratory Technology:

Brief Report:

The Department of Medical Laboratory Technology (MLT) at Rani Rashmoni Green University embarked on its academic journey with the introduction of the Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Medical Laboratory Technology programme during the 2025–2026 academic session. The first academic class was conducted on 23 October 2025, marking the beginning of a new milestone in the University's commitment to providing quality education and professional training in the field of medical laboratory sciences. From its inception, the department has focused on building a strong academic foundation by offering a well-structured



curriculum that integrates theoretical knowledge with extensive laboratory-based practical training. The programme has been designed to develop competent medical laboratory professionals equipped with scientific knowledge, technical expertise, ethical values, and research aptitude required in modern healthcare and diagnostic services. The curriculum covers key areas including Clinical Biochemistry, Human Anatomy and Physiology, Laboratory Pathology, Immunology, Haematology, Serology, Histotechnology, Cytotechnology, Clinical Microbiology, Medical Entomology, Parasitology, Molecular Diagnostic Techniques, Biomedical Instrumentation, Research Methodology, Epidemiology, Public Health, Bioinformatics, and Artificial Intelligence in Laboratory Medicine. The department organized an orientation programme to familiarize newly admitted students with the academic curriculum, laboratory regulations, examination system, internship opportunities, research prospects, and career opportunities in hospitals, diagnostic laboratories, research institutes, biotechnology industries, and public health organizations. Throughout the academic session, all theory classes, laboratory practical's, seminars, presentations, internal assessments, and continuous evaluation were conducted successfully according to the university academic calendar. The teaching-learning process was supported by experienced faculty

members and invited resource persons who provided both academic and practical insights into various aspects of medical laboratory technology. The department also ensured the smooth conduct of Board of Studies meetings, curriculum implementation, moderation of examinations, and other academic and administrative activities in coordination with the university authorities. Students actively participated in classroom discussions, laboratory demonstrations, practical exercises, assignments, and academic presentations, thereby enhancing their analytical, diagnostic, and professional skills. The Second Semester examinations were conducted and completed successfully, marking another important achievement in the department's first academic year. The successful completion of the initial phase of the programme reflects the department's commitment to academic excellence, quality assurance, and professional education. Building on this successful beginning, the Department of Medical Laboratory Technology plans to organize advanced laboratory workshops, hospital and diagnostic laboratory visits, expert lectures, skill development programmes, research-oriented activities, and state/national-level seminars in the forthcoming academic session. These initiatives will further strengthen students' practical competencies, research capabilities, and industry readiness while contributing to the University's vision of excellence in healthcare education.

Performance Summary: The 2025–26 batch marked the inaugural batch of the Department of Medical Laboratory Technology at Rani Rashmoni Green University. A total of seven students were enrolled in the programme and successfully completed the academic requirements up to the Second Semester examination, which was conducted successfully during the academic session.

Educational Visit and Hands-on Clinical Training at Rural Health Unit and Training Centre (RHUTC), Singur:

One of the major academic activities of the Department of Medical Laboratory Technology during the 2025–2026 academic session was an educational visit and intensive hands-on clinical training at the Rural Health Unit and Training Centre (RHUTC), Singur, a field training centre of the All-India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health



(AIIH&PH), Kolkata. During this training programme, students received comprehensive theoretical and practical instruction from experienced doctors, medical laboratory professionals, and faculty members of AIIH&PH. The training provided direct exposure to hospital and diagnostic laboratory practices, enabling students to work with real patient samples under expert supervision. The students were trained in various laboratory disciplines, including Clinical Haematology, Clinical Biochemistry, Clinical Microbiology, Medical Parasitology, Serology, Vector Biology, and Clinical Pathology. They observed and performed routine laboratory investigations such as complete blood count (CBC), blood grouping, hemoglobin estimation, peripheral blood smear examination, urine and stool analysis, microbiological culture techniques, parasitological identification, and various diagnostic procedures using modern laboratory equipment.



The programme also emphasized laboratory biosafety, quality assurance, standard operating procedures (SOPs), medical ethics, specimen collection and handling, infection prevention and control, record keeping, and professional laboratory practices. Students gained valuable experience in laboratory management, patient interaction, sample processing, interpretation of diagnostic results, and adherence to ethical standards in clinical laboratory services. Activity report: Report on Educational Visit to The Asiatic Society, Kolkata:

Department of English

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Comprehensive Report from the Office of the Registrar

(Timeframe: July 2025 – June 2026)

The Office of the Registrar strives to provide responsive, student-centered support while promoting operational efficiency and continuous improvement. Through its dedication to accuracy, professionalism and accountability, the office contributes significantly to the University's commitment to academic quality and institutional excellence.

The comprehensive Report from the Office of the Registrar, Rani Rashmoni Green University of the period July 2025 to June 2026 is as follows:

1. Roles and Core Responsibilities: As the academic and administrative core of the University, the Office of the Registrar manages student records and core academic processes with strict standards of accuracy, confidentiality, and integrity. The office act as a key liaison between the campus community and external partners, delivering reliable, student-centered services designed to support the University's mission and enhance the student experience.

2. Governance and Statutory Responsibilities: The Registrar provides strategic leadership in developing, improving and maintaining academic administrative systems, promoting the use of technology, and enhancing service delivery to support the University's educational mission. As a representative of university governance, the Office of the Registrar looks after various dimensions as follows:

- Coordination of Academic and Administrative Meetings

The Governing Board (G.B.) is the highest statutory body of the University; the Office of the Registrar has successfully conducted first as well another two meetings of the First Governing Board (G.B.) within the mentioned timeframe with prior approval from the Hon'ble Chancellor of RRGU and His Excellency the Governor of West Bengal and several other vital administrative meetings. The Office of the Registrar highlights key areas which need to be developed, progress of the University over time and



ensures effective outcome of these meetings for long term sustainable growth of the institution.

The office has initiated the process to frame the first Ordinance and Rules & Regulations of Rani Rashmoni Green University and Higher Education Department; Government of West Bengal has constituted a committee to cause the first Ordinance and Rules & Regulations of RRGU. The office has successfully completed the first meeting of the Statute Committee at the Calcutta University campus, to frame the first Ordinances and first Regulations on April 13, 2026.



- Leadership of Various Committees

The Registrar serves as the Chairperson or Convener for several committees of the university like Anti-Ragging Committee, Equal Opportunity Cell, Prevention of Caste Based Discrimination Committee etc. The Registrar ensures smooth functioning of these committees.

- Information Management and Communication

The Office of the Registrar is responsible for the official dissemination of significant University announcements to students and faculty. As a key communication channel between the University's senior leadership and the campus community, the office ensures that important academic and administrative information is communicated accurately and in a timely manner.

3. Student Services and Financial Aid: The Office of the Registrar remains the first point of contact for the students' body, managing the lifecycle of every learner from enrollment to graduation. For several student welfare services, the Registrar developed several student centric committees. A core priority of this office is the administration of state and national financial aid programs. Currently, following scholarship schemes are available for students seeking financial aid:

4. Digital Transformation: To enhance institutional communication, the Office of the Registrar has introduced new official email addresses under the “. ac.in” domain for key administrative positions, including the Registrar, Finance Officer, Development Officer, Controller of Examinations, and Secretary of Schools.

5. Organizational Structure: The Registrar’s Office is powered by a multidisciplinary team of officers and support staff: Executive Leadership: Registrar, Finance Officer, Controller of Examinations and Development Officer, Deputy Registrar, Secretary of the Schools, and Assistant Registrar.

Support Staff: Eleven Office Assistants and three Multi-Tasking Staff (MTS) members.

6. Strategic Growth and Sustainability: The Rani Rashmoni Green University is the only green University in the state of West Bengal as well as in the district of Hooghly. Currently the university is transitioning to its permanent campus at Baligori, near Tarakeswar and the campus construction work is going on smoothly. The University also proposes to the P.W. Department for Boys and Girls Hostel each has about 200 seat capacity and Staff quarters at adjacent places of the University’s Academic campus. In light of current conditions, we expect that the Academic Infrastructure may shift to its permanent campus by late 2027 or early 2028.

Presently thirteen (13) post-graduate subjects and one (01) PG Diploma programme has been offered by the University under the various Schools.

The University successfully conducted two projects received from the West Bengal Pollution Control Board. One is Campus Greenery Project, grant received under “National Clean Air Programme (NCAP) fund under the XV Finance Committee Grant” and another one is Environment Education Programme (EEP), grant received under Mission Life (Lifestyle for Environment) initiatives.

As a green university, RRGU prioritizes minimizing our environmental footprint through smart resource management, sustainable development, energy-efficient infrastructure and rigorous waste reduction protocols. By aligning our pursuit of academic distinction with proactive environmental

action, RRGU strives to set a benchmark for higher education institutions worldwide, proving that a sustainable campus is the foundation of a resilient and forward-thinking society.

- The Financial Year 2025-26 saw significant growth in academic achievements. 5(five) new subjects out of 8(eight) approved by HED were introduced.
- University has had a project on EEP (Environmental Education programme) to have been conducted during this year.
- Three-year Greenery project has been allotted by WB Pollution Control Board to Rani Rashmoni Green University, activities thereon has been taken up consistently.
- Functions involving BOS / Syllabus committees / other statutory and non-statutory Committees function has also increased to keep face with the required academic functions for the Institution.
- Seminar and similar activities also continued with necessary vigour and enthusiasm
- New Resource Persons were engaged to teach for new / existing subjects following CBCS mandate as was given to understand.

- As RRGU is gearing into the expansion mode righteously aspiring to get its new campus ready by 2027 end at Baligori, Tarakeswar.
- Expenses have increased in volume and variety posing a challenging situation for the Finance section to record, process, release payment and prepare accounts, but all have been done effectively.
- March 2026 onwards all major vendor payment is done by direct account transfer in the form of Bank Advice jointly signed by 2 signatures (out of three). Hence A/c payee cheque is almost discontinued.
- Internal audit has been done as stipulated by the RRGU.
- Rani Rashmoni Green University has got GST registration No 19CALR16907C1D9 in Sept 2025.
- GST regular filling is being done by existing Internal Auditor and Tax Consultant since March, 2026 on regular basis with due concurrence by 4th Finance Committee Meeting (FCM) held on 16.03.2026
- The fourth meeting of the First Finance Committee was held on March 16, 2026 at the Office of the Vice-Chancellor, at its present campus of Government General Degree College, Singur. The meeting was chaired by the Honourable Vice-Chancellor, Prof. (Dr.) Amiya Kumar Panda.

Shri Saumendra Narayan Mitra, Deputy Secretary, Finance Department, Nabanna, nominated member of Additional Chief Secretary, Finance Department, Government of West Bengal, Prof. Goutam Paul, Department of Physiology, University of Kalyani, nominated member by the Governing Board, Shri Sunit Mandal, Audit Officer, Vidyasagar University, nominated member of the Honourable Vice-Chancellor, RRGU and Sri Salil Chattopadhyay, Registrar (Oftg.) attended the meeting as the Member of the Committee. Shri Srijib Bardhan, Finance Officer, RRGU attended the meeting as the Convenor of the Committee. Shri Jayanta Mukhopadhyay, Audit Officer (Addl.Chg.), RRGU attended the meeting as the invitee member of the Committee. All agenda items were unanimously approved and adopted by the members and the meeting concluded with a vote of thanks from the Convenor of this committee.

The Finance Section of RRGU has had activities performed in a timely manner with due adherence to applicable norms and guidelines to the best knowledge and work accomplishments. Hierarchical approval/s is followed as the part of the process to deal with payments. Capital fund for campus building construction is being dealt directly by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal. Being a new Unitary University, all teaching faculty members are functioning as

Resource Persons. So also, the staff members are engaged through WTL. Hon'ble Vice-chancellor is only the full-time regular personnel, whereas other Officers are engaged on re-employment schemes. The Internal Audit has been done since inception for Annual Accounts prepared for the University. Hopefully days ahead will certainly have quality infrastructure, both physical and digital, along with manpower provisions to render continuance of quality and timely service towards all stakeholders of the University.

Report from the Office of the Secretary, Faculty Council for Post Graduate Studies, RRGU:

Rani Rashmoni Green University (RRGU) has been successfully continuing post graduate (PG) programs in Chemistry, Environmental Science, Bengali, English, Nutrition and Public Health, Journalism and Mass Communication, Library and Information Science, Master of Business Administration (MBA), Medical Laboratory Technology, Computer Science with the generous infrastructural supports from the Government General Degree College, Singur, Tarakeswar Degree College and Rabindra Mahavidyalaya, Champadanga.

Improvement of set up for practical classes of different subjects are being continued through arrangement of specific apparatus, purchasing essential chemicals, and structuring of experiments. Fourth semester PG students are pursuing their dissertation works and internship programmes in reputed institutions like KPC Medical College (Kolkata), Nephrocare India, (Salt Lake) Singur Rural Hospital (Hooghly), All India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health (Rural Hospital, Singur), Institute of Language Studies and Research Kolkata (ILSR), Asiatic Society, Ramkrishna Mission Institute of Culture. Additionally, dissertation and internship programs are going to be started at Ramkrishna Mission Institute of Culture at Golpark, Kolkata, Asiatic Society and many other new institutes.

Overall, 27 students from different departments have qualified NET/GATE/ SET and most of them are pursuing their PhD degree from eminent Universities/Institutes or doing jobs in reputed Institutes. The University has actively been promoting academic enrichment through different memorial lectures, seminars, symposia, and workshops.

Report from the Controller of Examinations

1. Performance of PG students during 2025-2026 in different subjects

During July to December, 2025, Semester 1 and Semester III examination schedule announced, moderation completed. Results of the examination after review process completion was announced during the middle of march for Semester III. All the six disciplines students performed well and review of by the students were reduced significantly. Results of the Semester 1 of all the 10 subjects were declared in the first week of April, in this semester also, students performed well with the reduction of the review process. Similarly, the examination schedule of SEM-II and SEM-IV were announced in the first week of June, 2026 and examination process including moderation and examination completed by July, first week for SEM-IV and July end of SEM-II. Performance of students were very good,

All the ten subjects of SEM-I and six subjects SEM-III results were declared and uploaded during March to April end, 2026. Similarly results of d SEMIV were uploaded during the third week of July, 2026 whereas results of SEM II will be uploaded at the end of July,2026.

The degree certificate of 98 students is under process of printing for SEM IV including total backlog printing of 358 students and rank certificate of 20 students. The base is ready with a hologram. Printing process preparation started and an estimate of 10.0 Lakh in different components was prepared for Governing Board approval followed by sanction form HED.

Report from the Office of the Dean of Students' Welfare

The academic session 2025-2026 witnessed significant progress in student welfare, particularly in the area of scholarship support. The University remains committed to ensuring that financial constraints do not hinder access to quality higher education. During the session, 90-95% of the enrolled students applied for various categories of scholarships offered by the Central Government, State Government, and other agencies. These included scholarships based on merit, attendance, caste, minority status, and economic background. It is encouraging to note that the majority of the applicants were successfully awarded scholarships during 2025-2026. Every year, a large proportion of students who apply receive financial assistance, reflecting both the effectiveness of the University's facilitation process and the eligibility of our student community. The scholarship award process stands as a testament to the institution's commitment to accessibility, equity, and inclusivity in education. Through timely verification, guidance, and coordination with scholarship portals and welfare departments, the Office of the Dean of Students' Welfare ensured that deserving students received due support without procedural delays. This financial assistance has played a crucial role in empowering students from diverse socio-economic backgrounds to pursue their academic goals with confidence. It has contributed to improved retention, better attendance, and enhanced academic performance across departments.

In conclusion, the consistently high rate of scholarship applications and awards reflects the University's dedication to fostering a culture of merit and inclusivity. The Office of the Dean of Students' Welfare will continue to strengthen support mechanisms and awareness programs to ensure that every eligible student benefits from available opportunities in the coming academic years.

Report from the Development Officer

Rani Rashmoni Green University was established on 9th January, 2018 as a State-aided Government University of West Bengal. The University received recognition from the University Grants Commission on 15th December, 2020.

In keeping with its vision of building a sustainable and environmentally responsible institution, the University is steadily progressing toward the development of its permanent campus at Baligori, Tarakeswar, District: Hooghly. The proposed permanent campus is spread over a total land area of 26,010.90 sq. m. The master plan envisages a total built-up area of 38,278.78 sq.m. with a ground coverage of 8,202.98 sq. m. The major infrastructure components include an Administrative Block, Academic Building, Auditorium, and essential utilities such as Substation and Fire Pump Room.

The Administrative Block is planned from Ground Floor to 8th Floor with a built-up area of approximately 10,413.478 sq. m. The Academic Building, planned from Ground Floor to 7th Floor, has a proposed built-up area of 24,843.369 sq. m, subject to revision as per the updated plan. The Auditorium will extend from Ground Floor to 2nd Floor with an area of 2,809.935 sq. m. The Substation and Fire Pump Room will cover 212 sq. m. Construction work by a new agency commenced on 19.01.2025 and is progressing satisfactorily.

We are optimistic that the Academic Building will be completed within the coming year. The Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, has accorded administrative approval of ₹194.213 crore for the overall campus development. Up to June 2025, financial sanction amounting to ₹15.07862 crore has been received in phases. These funds have supported preliminary planning, infrastructure development, and preparation of environmentally sustainable campus proposals. Under the Greenery Project, ₹11,10,000/- was sanctioned by the West Bengal Pollution Control Board. In consultation with the BDO, Tarakeswar, and in coordination with Baligori-I Gram Panchayat, fruit-bearing trees including coconut, mango, litchi, and guava were planted across the campus. Labour was engaged through the Gram Panchayat, and all payments were made by the University as per approved procedures.

The University remains committed to completing its infrastructure in a time-bound and eco-friendly manner.
