RRGU, which commenced its journey in 2019, is still in its embryonic state. The long-cherished dream of our own campus at Baligori, Tarakeswar, is finally being implemented in full swing. The proposed courses are: Journalism and Mass Communication, Anthropology, Fishery Science, Mathematics, Library and Information Science, Master of Business Administration (MBA), Medical Laboratory and Technology, a one-year Post Graduate Diploma in Agriculture Marketing and Management. These will be conducted at Rabindra Mahavidyalaya, Champadanga, and Tarakeswar Degree College Campus. Efforts are underway to initiate classes from the forthcoming academic session.

We are indebted to the authorities of Government General Degree College, Singur (GGDC), Tarakeswar Degree College (TDC) and Rabindra Mahavidyalaya, Champadanga, Hooghly, West Bengal for their magnanimities in extending their kind cooperation and continuous support.

Eminent persons have generously given their consents to join RRGU as Professor of Eminence and Excellence. Some noted scholars have also generously joined as Adjunct Professors. I am particularly indebted to all our esteemed Resource Persons who, irrespective of age, identity, or logistical constraints, have shown great interests towards our students. On behalf of the entire RRGU family, I convey my heartfelt gratitude to all our esteemed resource persons, Professor of Eminence and Excellence and

Adjunct Professors.

I proudly share a small yet significant achievement for our University: around twenty-seven students from all the existing departments have qualified for the NET/GATE/SET examinations till date. I pray that our beloved students will achieve many more such milestones in the future.

Message from the Registrar



It gives me great pleasure to present the Compendium of Annual Reports (2019-2025) of Rani Rashmoni Green University (RRGU). This publication brings together the academic, administrative, audited financial, and developmental activities of the University covering the period from February 2019 to June 2025. The compendium reflects the steady and purposeful progress made by the University in fulfilling its mandate as a State-aided institution committed to excellence in higher education with a special focus on environmental studies and interdisciplinary learning.

Established under the West Bengal Green University Act, 2017 and subsequently renamed through the West Bengal Green University (Amendment) Act, 2018, the University was conceived as a centre of excellence devoted to teaching, research, and knowledge dissemination in environmental sciences and allied disciplines. Since the assumption of office by the first Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Ashutosh Ghosh, on 20 February 2019, the University has gradually built its academic and institutional foundations despite numerous challenges, including the unprecedented disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

During its formative phase, the University commenced its activities from the West Bengal State Council of Higher Education and subsequently shifted its administrative and academic operations to Government General Degree College, Singur. Academic collaboration with Tarakeswar Degree College further facilitated the expansion of academic programmes. Through these arrangements, the University successfully could introduce postgraduate programmes in Chemistry, Environmental Science, Bengali, English, Nutrition and Public Health, and Computer Science, ensuring continuity of academic engagement while strengthening its academic profile.

A significant milestone in the institutional development of the University was the conferment of enlistment under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956 in December 2020. The approval and enforcement of the First Statutes of the University in November 2022 further consolidated the statutory and administrative framework necessary for the effective governance of the institution.

The University has entered a new phase of growth under the leadership of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Amiya Kumar Panda, who assumed office on December 18, 2024 as the first permanent Vice-Chancellor. His leadership has infused renewed momentum into the academic expansion and infrastructural development of the University.

Establishment of the proposed permanent campus at Baligori, Tarakeswar, Hooghly, remains a priority for the University. Administrative initiatives have been undertaken for the re-tendering and timely execution of the construction work to ensure the development of a modern and sustainable campus. In the interim, arrangements have been identified at institutions such as Baijnath Shaw College and Purusottampur Upper Primary School to facilitate the continuation and expansion of academic programmes.

In pursuit of academic diversification, the University has submitted a comprehensive proposal to the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, seeking approval for the introduction of several new postgraduate programmes. These include Journalism and Mass Communication, Anthropology, Fishery Science, Mathematics, Library and Information Science, Master of Business Administration (MBA), Medical Laboratory Science and Technology, and a Postgraduate Diploma in Agriculture Marketing and Management. These initiatives are expected to further strengthen the interdisciplinary and professional dimensions of higher education offered by the University.

Consistent with its founding vision, the University remains firmly committed to environmental sustainability. In pursuance of 'Green Policy of the University', the implementation of 'Campus Greenery Project', a significant initiative is conceived in promoting ecological awareness and sustainable campus development. The project is planned for execution with the financial and logistical assistance of the West Bengal Pollution Control Board and the Directorate of Forests, Howrah Division, which have extended help in acquiring also various rare and environmentally significant saplings.

The University has also actively promoted academic enrichment through memorial lectures, seminars, symposia, and workshops, thereby creating a vibrant intellectual environment for the students and the resource persons. The emphasis on dissertation work and internships in reputed institutions and industries has further strengthened the research orientation of postgraduate programs and enhanced students' practical exposure and professional preparedness.

From the administrative standpoint, the Office of the Registrar has continuously been endeavoring to ensure efficient institutional coordination, transparent governance, and effective implementation of the statutory provisions. Sustained efforts have been made to streamline administrative processes, strengthen communication systems, and facilitate cooperation among various academic and administrative units of the University.

Achievements highlighted in this compendium are the collective outcome of the dedication and commitment of the entire University community-our Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, esteemed members of the Governing Board, resource persons, officers, staff, and the students. RRGU family gratefully acknowledges the continued support and guidance extended by the Government of West Bengal and the Department of Higher Education.

As the University moves forward, its focus will remain on strengthening academic excellence, expanding research initiatives, promoting environmental stewardship, and advancing infrastructural development. Historiography of the University

As per Preamble:

An Act to provide for constitution and incorporation of the West Bengal Green University in the State of West Bengal and for certain matters incidental thereto and connected therewith.

Whereas it is expedient to establish and incorporate a State-aided University by the name of the West Bengal Green University with the view to establish a Centre of Excellence devoted to the teaching, learning and research in various branches of study attached to the environmental studies, surface management studies, bio-diversity management aiming to reduce the bad effect of pollution both in land, water, surface, noise and sight. The proposed University will be developed with all modern facilities by using all natural resources in order to sensitize and educate people at large the need of maintaining a pollution free world along with the emerging field of study of science, arts, laws and other related fields of studies.

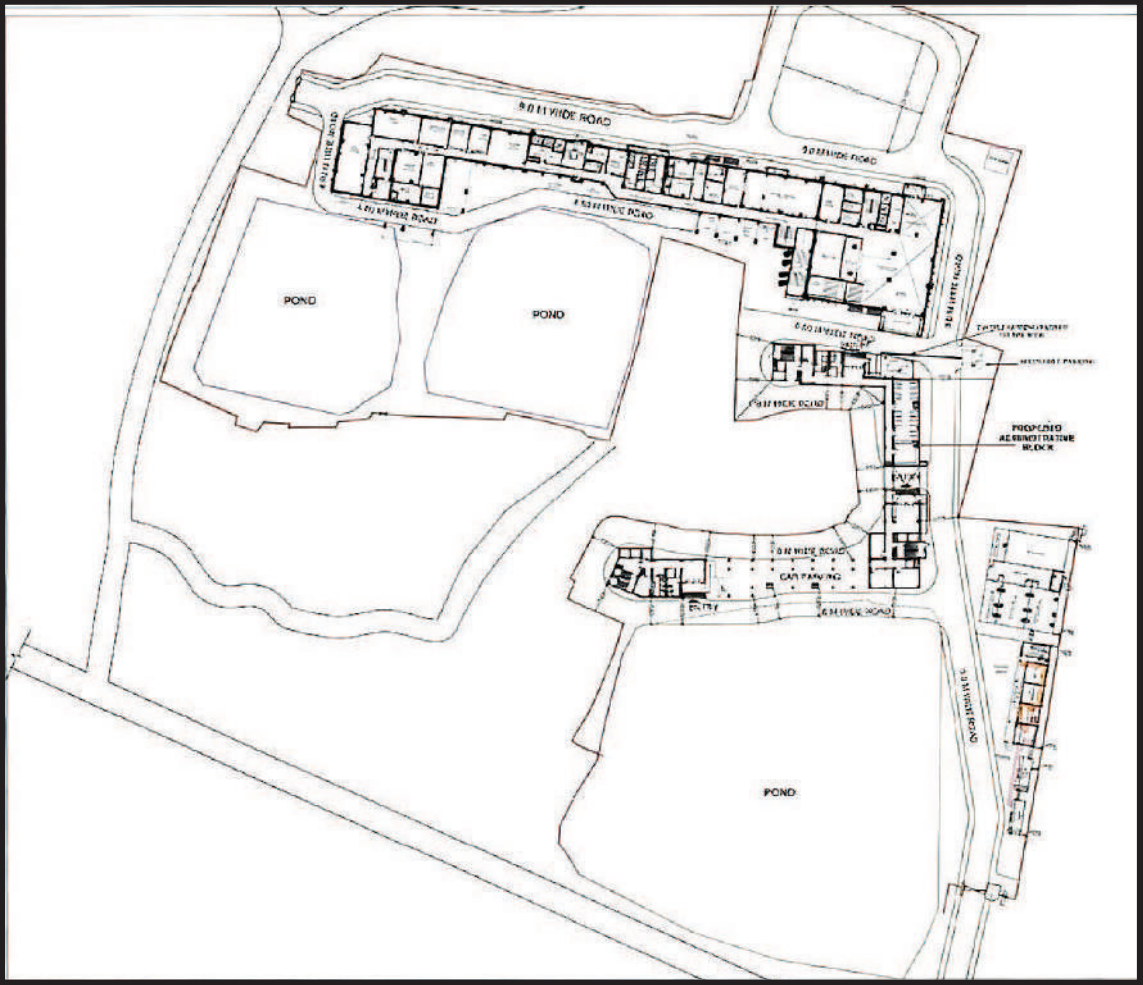
- The university was established under the West Bengal Green University Act, 2017; it was later on renamed as “**Rani Rashmoni Green University**” through the enactment of “THE WEST BENGAL GREEN UNIVERSITY (AMENDMENT) ACT, 2018”.
- Prof. Ashutosh Ghosh assumed the office of the Vice-Chancellor on February 20, 2019.
- RRGU commenced its journey in the office of the West Bengal State Council of Higher Education on February 20, 2019 with the joining of Prof. Ashutosh Ghosh as the Founder Vice-Chancellor. Later, it was shifted to the Government General Degree College, Singur, during the third week of October 2020. The proposed campus of RRGU has been acquired near Tarakeswar at Baligori, Tarakeswar, Hooghly. The construction of the boundary wall started on January 04, 2021.
- Simultaneously, during the covid period, academic activities started functioning (by maintaining the strict Covid19 protocol) temporarily from the Govt. General Degree College, Singur with two subjects, viz., Chemistry and Environmental Science vide the approval from the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal, w.e.f., October 06, 2020.
- RRGU was awarded enlistment under 2(f) of University Grants Commission Act, 1956 on December 15, 2020.
- University activities were further extended by the generous support from the Tarakeswar Degree College (TDC) in 2021 with the inception of three more subjects (Bengali, English and Nutrition & Public Health) and with addition of 1 (one) more subject (Computer Science) in Government General Degree College (GGDC), Singur. Those subjects getting approved on July 17, 2021.
- The First Statutes of the University came into force on 10.11.2022 with the kind approval of the His Excellency the Governor of West Bengal and the Hon’ble Chancellor of the RRGU.
- Prof. Amiya Kumar Panda joined as the Vice-Chancellor on December 18, 2024. To meet the minimum space requirements for conducting ongoing classes of six post graduate programs (Chemistry, Nutrition & Public Health, Computer Science, Environmental Science, English and Bengali) the District Magistrate, Hooghly, SDO Chandernagore, Executive Engineer Hooghly, BDO Singur, were approached to resolve the bottleneck related to the construction of RRGU new campus of Tarakeswar, Hooghly. Presently, four Masters programs are being conducted in the campus of Govt. General Degree College, Singur and two Masters programs (ENG, BENG) in Tarakeswar Degree College on classroom sharing basis.

- A comprehensive proposal has been submitted to the Dept. of Higher Education (HED), Government of West Bengal, seeking approval for the introduction of eight new Post Graduate programs. The proposed courses are: Journalism & Mass Communication, Anthropology, Fishery Science, Mathematics, Library & Information Science, Business Administration (MBA), Medical Laboratory & Technology, and one year post graduate diploma in Agriculture Marketing and Management, which will be conducted at Rabindra Mahavidyalaya, Champadanga and Tarakeswar Degree College Campus. Efforts are on to initiate the classes from the forthcoming academic session.
- In infrastructural advancement, HED and PWD have been approached for resolving the stalemate related to the construction of the proposed campus of RRGU at Tarakeswar, ensuring transparency and timely implementation.
- The Campus Greenery Project was successfully submitted to the West Bengal Pollution Control Board, Kolkata. Besides, the Directorate of Forests, Howrah Division, has also generously supported the endeavor by supplying saplings of rare species to combat environmental pollution.
- In pursuance of education programs of academic interest, the University has been regularly arranging memorial lectures, special lectures, seminars, symposia, and workshops for the benefit of the students as well the resource person.
- RRGU has all along taken initiative to arrange Dissertation projects/Internship for the students of Semester-IV at esteemed institutions, industries, etc. This opportunity could provide hands-on experience and industry exposure, enhancing students' research skills and industry readiness.

Research Infrastructure: Strengthening research capabilities with seed grants, research fellowships, and incubation centers.

Community Engagement: Promotion of community outreach through extension activities, rural internships, and participatory action research.

Digital Transformation: Implementation of digital solutions for governance, e-learning, and resource accessibility.

Institutional Values

- **Sustainability:** Protecting and enriching the environment through responsible practices.
- **Integrity:** Upholding ethics, accountability, and transparency in all actions.

Green Policy of the University

1. Title and Commencement:

- 1.1 This Policy shall be called the Rani Rashmoni Green University Green Policy – 2025 or hereafter called RRGU Green Policy-2025.
- 1.2 This Policy shall apply to the New Campus of RRGU at Tarakeswar, Hooghly, and shall regulate all future development of greenery, landscape and campus environment systems.

2. Vision to establish RRGU as a demonstration model of ecological sustainability in Eastern India through climate-responsible, indigenous biodiversity-based, circular and regenerative campus development practices.

3. Guiding Principles: The following principles shall guide all planning, development and management activities:

- a) Green Campus First (GCF) principle: Ecological and biodiversity considerations shall precede any civil construction.
- b) Native First (NF) principle: Preference to native, local, pollinator-friendly species of plants and trees.
- c) No Net Loss of Green (NNLG) principle: Minimum 1:3 tree replant ratio for any tree removal.
- d) Water Positivity (WP) principle: Rainwater harvesting, onsite recharge, recycling and grey water use shall be maximized.
- e) Zero Waste Campus (ZWC) principle: Biodegradable waste shall be converted to compost/manure and utilised for campus greenery.

4. Green Campus Development Components RRGU shall establish the following essential systems:

- a) Green Spine: Continuous linear plantation zone along the main transit axis of the campus.
- b) Micro Forests: (Miyawaki /Native Biodiversity Clusters) in multiple blocks of minimum 100 sq. m each.
- c) Thematic Gardens: (e.g., Medicinal Plant Garden, Bonsai Garden, Butterfly Garden, Agro-Ecology Learning Patch).
- d) Campus Herbarium and Seed Bank for conservation and academic research.
- e) Water Bodies & Recharge Structures: check dams, recharge pits, rain tanks.
- f) Solid Waste Segregation & Compost Yard to generate compost for campus.

5. Standards and Norms

- 5.1 Minimum 33% of total campus land area shall be earmarked and preserved as green cover.
- 5.2 Minimum 50% of annual fresh water demand shall be met through rainwater harvesting and water recycling by 2030.
- 5.3 Use of chemical pesticides or fertilizers shall be discouraged. Organic, integrated pest management (IPM) strategies shall be mandated.

6. Community Participation

- 6.1 University shall institute an RRGU Green Council headed by the Vice-Chancellor with student eco-volunteers, faculty and estate division members.
- 6.2 “One Student One Tree” program shall be implemented for new student batches.

Over the past five years, a significant number of students have successfully qualified for **NET, GATE, and SET** examinations. Several students have

also secured admission into **Ph.D. programs** and **Project Associate** positions (with potential transitions into Ph.D. programs) at renowned institutions in India and abroad.

Since 2021, Department of Chemistry, RRGU has actively collaborated with several **nationally reputed industries**, an initiative that has significantly benefited our students. Furthermore, the Department has successfully organized numerous **national and international seminars and workshops**, featuring eminent resource personnel from India and abroad. Over the past three years, several students have also achieved **top ranks** in various courses of SWAYAM NPTEL.

Upon publication, around **15 articles** authored or co-authored by students of the Department of Chemistry, RRGU, in various peer-reviewed journals indexed in Scopus and Web of Science. This milestone reflects our collective commitment to nurturing research excellence in our relatively young department.

Department of English

The Department of English at Rani Rashmoni Green University started its journey in the year 2021. The M.A. course was introduced with 33 students. Within a few years, the department became a premier centre of education under the aegis of the University. The department followed the CBCS and now NEP 2020 framework. Resource persons are responsive to the needs of the students, meet them outside the classrooms and provide them with academic and personal counselling. Overall results of the students in the University examinations have been satisfactory. Two students, Ms. Ankhi Roy (2022) and Ms. Riya Paul (2025), have qualified in the UGC-NET examination. In 2025, the fourth semester students (2023-2025) of the department completed the M.A., dissertation under ILSR Kolkata. On November 12, 2025, Prof Nandini Sahu, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of Hindi University, delivered her lecture "Let's go Theoretical", the first lecture of the 'Special Lecture Series' by eminent academics, jointly organized by the Department of English, Rani Rashmoni University and the Department of English, Tarakeswar Degree College. The Special Lecture Series on "Theories" had been conceived keeping in mind the fact that the students will get an exposure to the different theories in English Literature and how literary theories provide the necessary frameworks, or 'lenses' to approach, analyze, and interpret literature, revealing meanings far beyond the surface plot. The department also holds induction programs and various other cultural programs where the students regularly participate.

Report from the Office of the Secretary, Faculty Council for Post Graduate Studies, RRGU

The University has been successfully continuing the post graduate (PG) programmes in Chemistry, Environmental Science, Bengali, English, Nutrition and Public Health, and Computer Science at Government General Degree College, Singur. Academic collaboration with Tarakeswar Degree College from February, 2019 to July, 2025.

Post graduate programs in Journalism and Mass Communication, Anthropology, Fishery Science, Mathematics, Library and Information Science, Master of Business Administration (MBA), Medical Laboratory Science and Technology, and a Postgraduate Diploma in Agriculture Marketing and Management are starting from 2025 to 2026 session.

Improvement of set up for practical classes of different subjects are being continued through arrangement of specific apparatus, purchasing essential chemicals, and structuring of experiments. Fourth semester PG students are pursuing their dissertation works and internship programmes in reputed institutions like KPC Medical College (Kolkata), Nephrocare India, (Salt Lake) Singur Rural Hospital (Hooghly), All India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health (Rural Hospital, Singur), Institute of Language Studies and Research Kolkata (ILSR). Additionally, dissertation and internship programs are going to be started at Ramkrishna Mission Institute of Culture at Golpark, Kolkata, Sahitya Academy (Kolkata) and many other new institutes.

Overall, 27 students from different departments have qualified NET/GATE/ SET and most of them are pursuing their PhD degree from eminent Universities/Institutes or doing jobs in reputed Institutes. Students of the Chemistry department have published a significant number of papers (nearly fifteen) with the resource persons. The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of this University has published twelve papers in high-ranking International Journals.

The University has actively been promoting academic enrichment through different memorial lectures, seminars, symposia, and workshops.

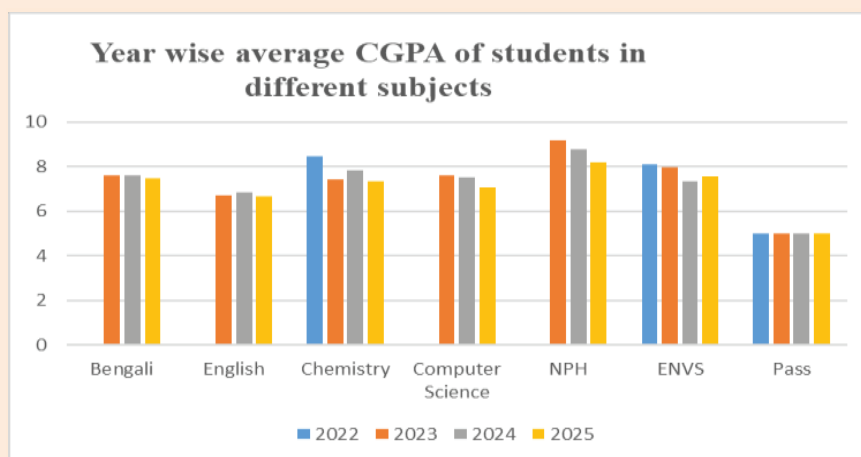

Report from the Controller of Examinations

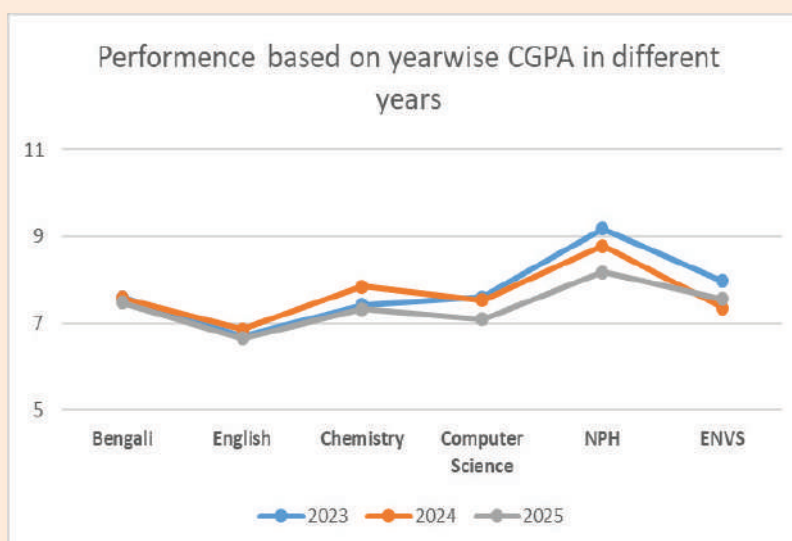
The Examination section has been actively involved in streamlining the examination processes through drafting/upgradation of rules and regulations, implementing them, and documenting them since 2020. We are constantly exerting ourselves to provide the support our students need. To better streamline the examination processes. From form fill-ups to generation of admit cards, to publishing results online, the whole process has been simplified. We are happy and proud to offer comprehensive support services to the students, beyond the core functions of examination conduct and publication of results. We are continuously evolving and are steadfast in the pursuit of academic excellence and providing top-class experience to our students.

1. Performance of PG students during 2022-2025 in different subjects

Data during the period of 2022 to 2025 for Chemistry and Environmental science; and for other subjects under examination were analyzed for the year 2023-2025. The average CGPA of different subjects was highest in Environmental science and lowest in English. The increase in average CGPA ranged between 34.8 to 74.3 % compared to pass CGPA (Fig.1).



It is observed that student performance based on year wise CGPA irrespective of subjects did not change significantly except Nutrition & Public Health (NPH) showing decreasing trend. over the years (2022 to 2025). Other subjects obtained more CGPA by 9.9 to 29.3 % (Fig1) when compared to English (3 yrs. average lowest CGPA).

In the present structure of course curriculum as per time table pre scheduled, two semesters are running simultaneously. Semester I and Semester III during the period of July to December and examination is held during Mid-January to February. Promoted semester II and Semester IV are running during March to August and examination is held during mid-August to September. It followed by cycling rotation based on semester performance promotion. The results of all the semesters are brought out / uploaded after 30-45 days of examination. Still date passed out batches were 2022 for Chemistry and Environmental Science and for all the subjects were 2023, 2024 and 2025.

3. Digi-locker/ National Academic Depository (NAD) portal

As mandated by the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Ministry of Education, Government of India, Rani Rashmoni Green University created Digi locker to function as a National Academic Depository. It serves as a 24/7 online, digital, and secure storehouse mark sheets presently for the year 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025.

4. Degree Certificate:

First of its attempt since the inception of the university, following the university management system (UMS), data set entry considering 55 to 70 parameters (depends upon subjects) for all the subject's data (2022-2025) were tabulated in a spreadsheet for the printing of degree certificates. It is expected the degree certificate will be awarded in a few months. A total of 358 degree certificates will be awarded of which 42 for 2022, 127 for 2023, 105 for 2024 and 84 for 2025 including all the subjects.

• Overview of Scholarships:

Out of the enrolled students, 90~95% students applied for the scholarship in several types of scholarships. Out of these applied students, majority students get the scholarships every year, on the basis of their attendance, merit, caste, minority, etc. Every year, a majority of students who apply for these scholarships receive them. The scholarship program has been instrumental in supporting students from diverse backgrounds, enabling them to pursue their academic goals.

By providing financial assistance to the deserving students, the institution aims to empower them to achieve their full potential. In conclusion, the high application and award rates for scholarships demonstrate the institution's efforts to support students from various backgrounds, promoting a culture of merit and inclusivity.

Report from the Development Officer

Rani Rashmoni Green University, established on January 09, 2018 as a State-aided Government University of West Bengal, continues to pursue its vision of developing a sustainable and environmentally responsible academic institution. The University received recognition from the University Grants

Commission on December 15, 2020 and has gradually been progressing with the development of its permanent campus at Baligori, Tarakeswar in the district of Hooghly.

The proposed permanent campus has a total land area of 26,010.90 sq. m, with a planned total built-up area of 38,278.78 sq. m and a ground coverage area of 8,202.98 sq. m. The campus master plan includes major infrastructure components such as the Administrative Block, Academic Building and Auditorium, along with essential utility facilities including a Substation and Fire Pump Room. The Administrative Block is planned from Ground Floor to 8th Floor with a built-up area of approximately 10,413.478 sq. m, while the Academic Building, also planned from Ground Floor to 7th Floor, has a proposed built-up area of 24,843.369 sq. m (subject to revision as per the updated plan). The Auditorium extends from Ground Floor to 2nd Floor with a built-up area of 2,809.935 sq. m, and the Substation and Fire Pump Room cover an area of 212 sq. m.

The Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal has accorded administrative approval of ₹194.213 crore for the overall development of the University campus. Up to June 2025, the University has received financial sanction amounting to ₹10.07862 in phases. These funds have enabled the University to undertake preliminary planning, infrastructure development activities and preparation of environmentally sustainable campus development proposals.

Consistent with the vision of establishing a model Green University, the institution has adopted a strong policy framework for environmental sustainability. In this context, the University formulated the RRGU Green Policy–2025, which seeks to promote ecological conservation, biodiversity enhancement, water sustainability and environmentally responsible waste management within the campus.

As part of this initiative, the University has prepared a comprehensive Greenery and Biodiversity Development Proposal for the Tarakeswar campus. The proposal envisages the development of extensive green infrastructure across the campus including plantation corridors, biodiversity clusters and thematic gardens. Key components of the proposal include the establishment of a Green Spine plantation corridor, development of micro-forests using native plant species, and creation of thematic gardens such as a Medicinal Plant Garden, Butterfly Garden and Agro-Ecology Learning Patch. These initiatives are intended to enhance the ecological value of the campus while also serving as living laboratories for academic learning and research.

The proposal also includes measures for rainwater harvesting, groundwater recharge structures and sustainable waste management systems, including composting of biodegradable waste generated within the campus. In accordance with the University's Green Policy, it has been proposed that at least 33% of the total campus area will be maintained under green cover, with preference given to native and ecologically suitable plant species.

In order to ensure environmental compliance and seek expert guidance for implementation of the project, the University has submitted the detailed greenery development proposal to the West Bengal Pollution Control Board. The submission outlines the University's commitment to developing a climate-responsive, biodiversity-rich and environmentally sustainable campus.

The initiative represents an important step toward realizing the University's long-term vision of creating a living green campus that integrates environmental stewardship with education, research and community engagement. Implementation of the proposed measures will be undertaken in a phased manner following the necessary approvals and guidance from the concerned authorities.
